I would love to share the recipe of "Chilli garlic Hakka noodles " from the heart of my home. It is a very simple recipe that you can pull together in 15 min. This recipe is very close to my heart as it's inspired from my moms attempt to make noodles. During 90s, me and my brother used to study in Day Boarding School. We used to come home in the evening hustling with our hunger pangs. Those days we just got introduced with indo Chinese cuisine. Actually chowmein, Hakka noodles & instant noodles like maggi. But my parents were very strict towards our eating habbits. We barely used to go out for dine in or takeouts as my parents preferred to feed us homemade food. Noodles were our all time favourite. So my mom started looking for recipes in magazines and newspapers as there was no internet back then. She attempted to make restaurant style hakka noodles at home with minimal available ingredients. Some attempts were failures and some were simply disasters. But then she figured out a recipe by using seasonal veggies along with french beans and al dente noodles. It was just the hit in our home.

Of course she skipped Ajinomoto (monosodium glutamate), as it wasn't easily available back then. But she somehow managed to achieve great results. We used to smile widely, dancing with joy whenever we used to come home and found hakka noodles made by mom in her little black karahi (Indian wok). Years later, this turned out to be one of my signature recipe with some added ingredients and everybody loves it after trying. I trust it will also be to your liking.

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RECIPE: CHILLI GARLIC HAKKA NOODLES



INGREDIENTS REQUIRED: PROCEDURE:

200 g boiled hakka noodles

2 tbsp cooking oil

1 tbsp chopped garlic

1/2 cup french beans

1/4 sliced onion

1/4 sliced bell pepper

1/2 cup julienned carrot

1/2 cup julienned cabbage

2 tbsp chilli garlic sauce

salt & pepper as per taste

1 tbsp soy sauce

1 tbsp schezwan sauce

1 tsp sriracha sauce

1 tbsp vinegar

1 tsp Ajinomoto

1/2 tbsp sriracha sauce (optional)

1 tbsp sesame oil

sesame seeds & spring onion for garnish

- Boil water in a pot with added salt and little bit oil.
- Now add the noodles and cook it till al dente.
- Strain the noodles under cold water, toss it with 1 tbsp oil and keep on side so that they wont stick together.
- · Heat oil in a wok & add garlic and french beans. Cook it till garlic turns golden brown and beans are soft.
- Now add onions, bell pepper and sauté for 2 minutes.
- Once its done, add carrots & cabbage. Sauté it for another
- · Now add the noodles, chilli garlic sauce, Schezwan sauce, sesame oil, sriracha sauce, soy sauce, vinegar, Ajinomoto, salt and pepper
- Toss it well and sauté for 2-3 minutes.
- Once noodles are done, serve the noodles in a plate or bowl garnished with sesame seeds and spring onions.

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
